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ORDER READY FOR DISPATCH

Before a vehicle leaves the warehouse, every order is validated, prioritized, and assigned to the right run.

-  Orders are verified and grouped
-  Delivery time windows are checked
-  Vehicle capacity is allocated
-  Priority shipments are identified

Routes are optimized to balance speed, efficiency, and customer commitments before the first delivery begins.
